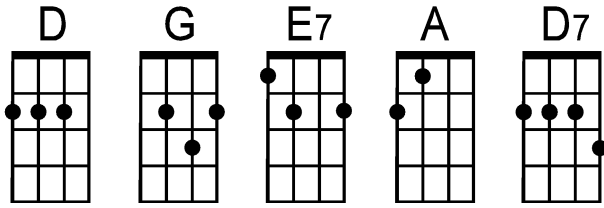


Five Pounds o' Possum
