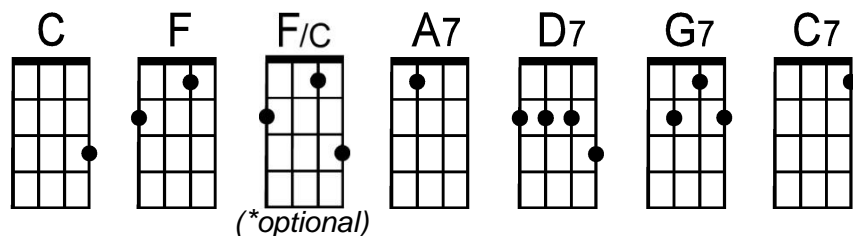


Stand Up and Sing for Your Father an Old Time Tune
